Blue Ocean Barns - Brominata Enteric Methane Demonstration Project

Blue Ocean Barns has listed its first carbon credit project on Verra's Verified Carbon Standard (VCS) Registry. The project is scheduled to begin in June 2022, which will consist of feeding Blue Ocean Barn's proprietary feed additive, Brominata[™] to cows on beef and dairy farms in the United States. All greenhouse gas (GHG) reductions will be quantified using the <u>VCS VM0041 Methodology</u>, *Methodology for the Reduction of Enteric Methane Emissions from Ruminants through the Use of Feed Ingredients* (v2.0 December 21, 2021). Brominata[™] is made of *Asparagopsis taxiformis*, a type of red seaweed, that has been shown to reduce enteric methane production in cows by ~80% (please see the full Project Description Document on the VCS Registry for citations). Brominata[™] is Generally Recognized as Safe (GRAS) under the scope of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (2017) . Additionally, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) has authorized commercial use of the supplement as a digestive aid for cattle through issuance of a "No Objections Letter" after reviewing the independent GRAS conclusion.
